January Annual Table Quiz

April 2025. Dr John O'Sullivan from Met Éireann gave a presentation on how Ireland's maximum temperature of 33.3 C has been re-investigated.

May 2025. Andrew Parnell, Met Éireann Professor of Data Science for Weather and Climate at University College Dublin from UCD gave a presentation on Weather extremes in Ireland from 1942-2022.

June 2025. Conor Thompson Lally, Applications Meteorologist in Met Éireann's Research and Application Division gave a insightful talk on how Meteorology shaped one of the most significant moments of the 20th century the D-Day landing in June 1944.

September 2025. Tido Semmler Senior Research Fellow in global and regional climate modelling in Met Éireann spoke on The Atlantic Meridional Overturning Circulation (AMOC) in a high-resolution climate model with and without Greenland freshwater input

October 2025. Maureen McCann a broadcast meteorologist from Spectrum 13 News channel in Orlando, Florida, USA spoke about hurricane news coverage in Florida, and storms which affect both Florida and Ireland.

November Evelyn Cusack and Séamus Walsh went into the process of writing a book together on Ireland's weather and climate. How they sourced material, what made the cut and what didn't and how they managed to keep their sanity while constantly revising their text and never missing a deadline.
